The elected officers are:

- A Chairperson, who convenes and chair meetings;

- A Secretary, who maintains membership; co-ordinates press and communications work and acts as the voice of the alliance, and maintains the alliance between the Steering Committee and General Meetings;
- A Treasurer, who manages the bank account;
- An Organiser, who is responsible for outreach and campaigning.

The Steering Committee will work by consensus where possible, or by majority vote if necessary.
